On motion of Mr. Oberdorffer, the following resolution was adopted.

RESOLVED: That the actual and necessary expenses of one delegate from each County Institute Society to the State Round Up Institute, at Mt. Pleasant, in the year 1909, shall be allowed and paid, with a maximum limit of Five Dollars. Provided, That in the case of delegate from the Upper Peninsula, the maximum shall be Ten Dollars.
