No. 80 of the Session Laws of 1905, and calls special attention to the wild life on rule which states that "no person shall hunt, shoot or trespass upon any part or College lands portion of the lands herein referred to." This shall be understood to mean that ()a) Except under proper authority no person shall shoot, trap, destroy or in any way harm, molest or annoy any of the birds, squirrels or other animals found upon the College grounds, whether such birds and animals are held to be harmful or not, and whether protected or not under the general laws of the State.

(b) The use of firearms of any kind, and for any purpose, and also of air-rifles or air-guns, is absolutely prohibited on all College grounds--campus, gardens, farm, fields, woods and river-- and the carrying of any such weapons on College lands or in boats on the river is strictly forbidden, except under proper authority.

(C)Authority to suspend the above rules or any part of them in special cases is vested in a committee consisting of the President of the College, the Dean of the Agricultural Division, and the heads of the Military, Horticultural, Forestry, and Zoology Departments."
