2．The appointment of Dr．E．R．Carlson as teaching assistant three－fourths time， fall term，1927，in the Department of Anatomy，to be paid ${ }^{3} 300$ in three equal installments on October 31，November 30，and December 31， 1927.

4．The employment of Mr．Philipp Abbas as instructor in Cello，as a term instruc－ tor only，at the rate of $\$ 35$ per week，effective October 11，and to continue un－ til the end of the present fall term．

On motion of Wr．McColl，it was voted to approve the above changes in salary．
4．That the President and Dean Ryder be authorized to secure assistance in the Hist－ ory Department，if it becomes necessary．

On motion of Mr．Watkins，it mas voted that the above request be granted．
5．Endorsing the recommendation of Dean Shew approved by Director Willard to raise Mr． Dibble＇s salary to \＄2400，effective July 1，1927；it being understood that this ad－ vance is due to the special work which he is being intrusted With in connection with com－borer control，and that the salary is subject to reconsideration and re－ adjustment at the end of the present year if it is deemed advisable． It was recommended that Mr．Geo．Getman＇s resignation be accepted and that Mr．E． J．Wheeler be apointed to the position made vacant by Mr．Getman and that his sal－ ary be $\$ 200$ per year，beginning October lst．

On motion of Mr ．McColl，it was voted that the above recommendation be approved．
6．Appröral of Dean Shaw＇s recammendation that Mr．A．J．Patch＇s salary be advanced fram $\$ 2400$ to $\$ 220$ ，effective July 1，1927； 2400 to be paid fram Bxtension funds and $\$ 420$ from Experiment Station Funds．

7．Approval of the redommendation of the Extension Service and Dean Shaw that Mr．J． A．Davidson＇s resigmation be accepted，and Mr．Otis E．Shear be appointed in his place as Extension Poultryman，effective December 1， 1927 at a salary of $\$ 2400$ per yr．

8．Approval of the request of the Extension Service and Dean Shaw for the appointment of Mr．C．R．Oviatt to the position of Extension Specialist in Sugar Beet Culture With the provision that the salary of $\$ 3600$ be offered him，effective November ist or as soon after that date as he can arrange to take up his work．

9．Approval of Director Millard＇s recommandion that the Board grant the request of Ogemaw County Board of Sipervisors for an increase in the allotment of funds toward the salary of the County Agricultural Agent，from $\$ 1800$ to $\$ 2400$ a jear，effective Jamary 1， 1928.

To report on the history of the buaget，and of all Board and Committee actions，on financial matters，for approximately the past five years．
To report on such other aspects of financial procedure as may be requested of them by either the Secretary or the President．

6．The Secretary read a letter from Miss Bicking of the State Department of Public Instruc－ tion reporting that the rocal and orchestral High Bcinol Music Contests are to be held in Ann Arbor this year，and the Band Contest at M．S．C．

7．The Secretary read a letter from Professor Richards reporting that he had invited the State Department of Public Instruction to hold future High School Music Contests at H．S．C．

RECOMAINDAT IONS FROM DEANS．DIRECTORS OR OTHER OFFICERS FOR ACTION OF THE BOARD
1．Coach Young recomended that the difference between the salary paid Miss Supple last year and that paid her succewsor，Hiss Parker，$\$ 360$ ，be divided eevally among Misses Grimes，Fickes and Andierson，increasing each salary by $\$ 120$ ，efiective September 1, 1927.
