Michigan State University



... founded in 1855 as the first agricultural college in the nation, set the pattern for the system of 68 land-grant colleges and universities established under the Morrill Act of 1862.

... has a campus rated one of the most beautiful in the world. Bisected by the Red Cedar River, the 4,900-acre East Lansing campus includes one of America's most extensive collections of woody plants. It has some 5,300 different species of trees, vines, and shrubs.

... has a School for Advanced Graduate Studies and 12 colleges: Agriculture, Arts and Letters, Business, Communication Arts, Education, Engineering, Home Economics, Justin Morrill, Natural Science, Social Science, Veterinary Medicine, and the University College.

... is the site of the multimillion-dollar Atomic Energy Commission-MSU Plant Research Laboratory, now under construction in the science complex. The facility will house basic studies on plants and the ways in which they are affected by radiation.

... has a new science complex which includes the space-age Abrams Planetarium, a 50-million-volt cyclotron, and new buildings for chemistry, biochemistry, and veterinary medicine.

... is conducting more than 1,600 research projects. Research tools include a giant computer, the Control Data 3,600.

... is one of the 10 largest universities in the nation, with more than 35,000 on the East Lansing campus. Students come from all 50 states and more than 80 foreign nations.

... is a leader among American universities in international programs, with technical assistance and research programs in 12 countries and professional involvement with 25 foreign educational institutions.

... participates in 13 major sports in intercollegiate competition: football, basketball, baseball, indoor and outdoor track, cross country, swimming, wrestling, hockey, fencing, gymnastics, tennis, golf, and soccer.
