

MAJORITY RULE NOW IN SOUTHERN AFRICA

Black people, who are the vast majority in Southern Africa, are virtually slaves in their own countries with no legal rights. In Azania (South Africa), the movement for majority rule is demanding an end to the illegitimate Vorster regime. Freedom fighters in Zimbabwe (Rhodesia) are refusing to participate in Ian Smith's phony "compromise" government. The liberation movements in Zimbabwe, Azania and Namibia (Southwest Africa) have vowed to settle for nothing less than political power and the overthrow of white domination. We support majority rule and oppose special privileges for settlers and foreign nationals in Africa.



END US TIES WITH SMITH AND VORSTER REGIMES

The US helps to prop up the illegal Smith and Vorster regimes because of the huge profits to be made off the slave-like conditions. In the US, the movement against apartheid is demanding that all corporations and banks pull out of South Africa. There have been huge demonstrations and resolutions calling for an end to all political, cultural and sports exchanges.

COMPLETE ECONOMIC BOYCOTT OF SOUTH AFRICA

Any foreign investments in South Africa only serve to maintain the brutal system of apartheid. The US corporations justify their \$2 billion investments by saying how they can be a force for "peaceful change." But in reality they are funneling millions into the Vorster government while proposing a minor face-lift. Andrew Young, their spokesman, wants to limit black demands to "equality in working condition" and "civil rights". The main thing he wants to do is prevent black people from having any political power.

SUPPORT THE OAU

Our principles are based on the charter of the Organization of African Unity (OAU) which reads: "To promote unity and solidarity among African states, strengthen their co-operation in the fields of politics, external affairs, economy, culture and defense: defend state sovereignty, territorial integrity and independence, eradicate all forms of colonialism from Africa and promote international co-operation."

HELD AFRICAN DINNER: IN JAN.

FREE THE PAC 18

CURRENTLY, our main activities are around freeing the PAC 18. These are members of the PAC who are on trial in South Africa for organizing the people to stand up against apartheid. We are circulating petitions, raising money and doing ongoing educational work to FREE THE PAC 18.

ALSO, we are determined to completely rid Dayton of the KRUGERRAND, the gold coin that is mined by slave labor and whose sale directly props up the apartheid system.

OUR STAND

Our committee is based on the following principles:

AFRICA FOR THE AFRICANS

The nations of Africa are standing up for their independence and self-determination. One by one, the colonial powers are being kicked out as the African people unite to demand control of their own resources, economy and government.

US, USSR OUT OF AFRICA

The main obstacle to a united Africa has been the meddling of the two superpowers, the US and the USSR. The US has suffered great defeats at the hands of the African countries and people and is trying desperately to hold on to its vested interests. The USSR, who claims to be a "natural ally" of the African people, is attempting to split and weaken countries and liberation movements. Resistance has been growing to the presence of Cuban troops who are doing the dirty work for the Soviets in Ethiopia, Eritrea, Angola and Zaire.
