Hundreds of thousands of Americans wait in endless lines for health, welfare, and soon to be exhausted unemployment benefits; more and more young people are being put on the streets, deprived of educational programs because of funding cutbacks while the U.S. government, in open military alliance with the racist South African regime, has been, and still is, putting hundreds of millions of dollars into financing yet another war—this time in Angola.

Like Vietnam, it is an undeclared war, with the Ford and Kissinger administration stating, "American people and Congress be damned, only we make decisions." Like Vietnam, the war we finance in Angola is a vicious assault upon the legitimate government—the MPLA-led Peoples Republic of Angola; it is an assault upon Angolan men, women, and children and their right to determine their own lives.

Foreign adventures like this are no accident. The history of the U.S. involvement in Vietnam, Chile, and all over the world is an insidious one. We must end that story. It is time for a new chapter. The U.S. must pull out of Angola in every way—money should be spent here, for jobs and social services, not wars abroad. Mercenaries must not be recruited here. Our government must recognize the Peoples Republic of Angola and break all ties with the racist regime in South Africa.
