Dear Dave,

A clarion call is being issued to all freedom loving people in America to join the American-South African Peoples' Friendship Association which is trying to help the people of South Africa realize everybody's lifetime goal - freedom and self-determination.

The continued violation of human rights by the South African racist settler government in defiance of all civilized public opinion around the world has reached new depths of degradation. The 24 million Blacks continue to be strangled politically, economically, and socially by the laws and acts passed through the 172 white law-makers in a Parliament which allows Blacks no representative of their own whatsoever. This indescribable human abomination has been the stock-in-trade of the South African legal system since the settlers arrived in 1652. The most recent atrocity in this long history of racist cruelty and oppression is the abominable murder of 42 Africans in Maseru, Lesotho, on December 19, 1982, by the South African army which butchered many people (including women and children).

Our plea to you and your friends is to join our organization and together we shall explore ways and means in which we can work in unison towards scrapping the appalling conditions being visited on the Black majority of South Africa. We seek to cut across the political, economic, and social backgrounds of the people of these two potentially great countries - the U.S.A. and South Africa - uniting the people by means of dialogue, study, and any other programs at our disposal.

We therefore request you and your friends - two or three or whatever number - to help form a chapter of ASAPFA in your area. Within a year we hope to have a national conference at some mutually convenient spot to hammer out ways and means in which we could best accelerate freedom in South Africa. We need all the co-ordinated efforts of people like you to help the legitimate struggle of the people of South Africa.
