Fundraiser Dance January 19 for Daliwe, South Africa

Please mark Saturday, January 19 on your calendars. A fundraising dance featuring a local band playing African music is scheduled on that date at the University Baptist Church Social Hall. The band(s) will be

playing from 7:00- 11 p.m. Tickets will be sold at the door on a sliding scale between \$5:00 and \$10:00. No one will be turned away for lack of funds.

The purpose of the fundraiser is to help Sharon Henderson, a key participant in the Project, travel to Daliwe in February. The Task Force on Southern Africa of the CCGS does *not* advocate that people travel to South Africa *unless they have been invited by an anti-apartheid organization*. Sharon's trip meets these requirements.

Sharon has been invited to Daliwe by Mike Kenyon, an organizer with the Grahamtown Rural Committee, which is a support group for many South African communities that are resisting the 30-year-old apartheid policy of forced removals. Kenyon was in Seattle briefly earlier this year on his way home after participating in a national conference on apartheid land

policies in Berkeley, California. Sharon was invited to meet with church women and seek out ways that church women in Seattle can become more involved with the women in Daliwe. Sharon is also hoping to prepare the way for a trip to Daliwe later this year by representatives of the Mayor's office and the Seattle City Council.

The Seattle-Daliwe Sister Community Project was launched earlier this year with an official Seattle City Council resolution and the blessings of Mayor Norman B. Rice. It seeks to assist residents of Daliwe, South Africa, a township community in the Eastern Cape, who are resisting forced removal from their century-old community by apartheid authorities.

Those working in the Project write letters to U.S. and South African officials to keep the pressure on the apartheid regime until change toward eliminating is irreversible (as defined by the African National Congress and its supporters, including the African National Congress).

Project workers also try to educate the Seattle Community about the continuing brutality of apartheid and the need to continue and intensify sanctions against the regime.
