

Dear Mr. Reed:

At Boipatong 42 black South Africans were murdered, many while sleeping in their beds as the police stood by. At Bisho 29 peaceful protesters were slain by Pretoria's puppet Ciskei police. The South African government has failed to halt the killing of more than 7,000 people since February, 1990, as apartheid continues.

Meanwhile CITIBANK retains day-to-day business ties to South African banks which have been criticized at home for lending to Pretoria but not to their own communities of color. These "correspondent" relations help South African banks do their international business as usual, and defer the day of peace and democracy in South Africa.

I urge you to signal Pretoria that government-sponsored violence and minority rule must end by severing CITIBANK's correspondent relationships with all South African banks and refraining from issuing any new loans to South Africa until a representative interim government is established there.
