Guinea Bissau declared independence from Portugal Sept. 24 by a 120-person National People's Assembly meeting in Guinea. The declaration comes after a decade of guerrilla warfare led by the African Party for the Independence of Guinea (P.A.I.G.C.) which controls more than 75% of the country. Delegates to the assembly were chosen by popular elections a year ago in which more than 77,000 people voted in all areas of liberated Guinea Bissau.

In solidarity with the people of Guinea, this event has been called to show the support of people in the United States for the people in Guinea.

Sharfudine Khan, representative to the United Nations for FRELIMO (Mozambique Liberation Front) will speak on the significance of the declaration of independence by P.A.I.G.C. to the other independence movements in the Portuguese colonies.

The event is sponsored by many groups and individuals including Southern Africa Support Committee and Black American Law Students Association. The Southern Africa Support Committee is an anti-imperialist organization which has been in existence since March, 1973. The purpose of this organization is to publicize the brutal realities of the exploitation to which Africans are being subjected by capitalist countries, to call on progressive people to organize a united front against imperialism, and also to serve the African liberation movements in any other way possible.
