Rep. Diggs (D.) was the first Black elected to the House from Michigan. He founded the Congressional Black Caucus and was U.S. delegate to the U.N. in 1971, but resigned in protest of U.S. policy toward Portuguese Africa. Presently, he is Chairman of the House Foreign Affairs Subcommittee on Africa and is concerned with reversing our support of Portugal in its colonial wars. Portugal has been fighting three such wars - in Guiné, W. Africa, and in Mozambique and Angola in Southern Africa.
