Dear Friends and Members of the Coalition,

As you know, the Coalition of Stop Rhodesian and South African Imports has had as its main thrust the stopping of ships as they come into the Phila. port. This has meant a steady and tremendous amount of work on the docks in itself. Now we have embarked on the huge task of broadening and extending the work of the Coalition to include much more Community education and action. Our Second major step in this direction will be with the showing of the movie "Last Grave at Dimbaza", a documentary filmed underground in one of the "settlement camps" that have been built to house African Workers and their families.

So far, we have showings scheduled for five community centers in North Philly, West Philly, Germantown, Kensington, and Chinatown, plus showings on three campuses, besides the main showing at International House. In order to really do a good job in getting people out to see the film, we would like to form brigades of three people to be assigned to each neighborhood to work with the sponsoring group to leaflet, post posters, and do anything that is generally needed to spread the word. These brigades will also help us to build better and stronger relations with all the groups involved. Therefore, in order to get this together, we are calling for another meeting. If you have been unable to come to meetings for a while, please make every attempt possible this time. It will mean a sucessful organizing of the movie or an unsucessful one.

Also on the agenda for this meeting will be: a discussion of the work and problems around the last ship, and, following from the very exciting report (although it was not formal) from the Ethiopian Brother we will have an educational on the present status of the political situation in Southern Africa. The Interim Committee has been following these events carefully and anyone and everyone will be encouraged to participate in the discussion. A number of people have told us they thought it was important to limit the number of agenda items so as to be able to focus on the main things and still leave time for the kind of educational program that we all need to really carry forward the struggle. We hope that this meeting will be the first such meeting in that general direction.

So, the meeting will be held at HOUSTON HALL, University of Penn., 34 & Spruce Sts., at 11:00 am, on SUNDAY, MARCH 23. THAT IS THIS SUNDAY
