

# If You Bank at Citibank, You're Banking in South Africa And Supporting Apartheid.

Citibank extended loans to the South African government after the Sharpeville massacre in 1960 and after the Soweto massacre in 1976. These loans strengthened the apartheid regime and freed government funds for direct military and police spending. Since South Africa has no oil deposits of its own, part of that money was used to buy the oil and gasoline without which the South African police and army cannot roll. The major supplier of that oil and gas is still Shell. By selling to the South African government, Shell not only fuels police attacks in the black townships, it makes possible South African invasions of Zambia, Angola and Mozambique, countries which support the anti-apartheid struggle.

Citibank is the only US bank which still loans money to South Africa. And when they do this, they support a government which denies citizenship to 25 million South African blacks, prohibits them from voting in the land of their birth, imprisons and tortures children as young as twelve years old, attacks striking miners with dogs and whips, pays lower wages to blacks than whites, provides free education to white children while charging blacks for their inferior education, and provides grossly inadequate medical and hospital care for blacks. Neither Citibank nor Shell have to be in South Africa. Barclay's Bank sold its assets and withdrew. Eastman Kodak ended its South African business and will make no more sales there. Citibank and Shell will apparently leave only when it is no longer profitable for them to stay. We have to help bring that about. Already, twenty national churches have withdrawn deposits and divested Citicorp stock valued at over \$120,000,000.
