Noting with grave concern that some Governments, in pursuing strategic and economic and other interests, continue to collaborate with the racist regime of South Africa and thereby encourage it to persist in its criminal policies...

Calls upon all Governments to take effective action to prohibit all loans or investments in South Africa by banks and corporations within their national jurisdictions...

Requests all agencies within the United Nations system to refrain from any dealings with corporations which provide any loans to, or make any investments in South Africa."

ABOLITION OF PASSES AND COORDINATION OF MOVEMENT ACT



YOU ARE REQUIRED BY LAW to carry this passbook on your person at all times. Failure to do so is grounds for arrest and imprisonment.

YOU ARE ALLOWED TO LIVE and work only at the designated location. Movement outside these limits is strictly prohibited.

YOUR LICENSE TO WORK is subject to revocation at the slightest provocation. As a worker you cannot organize officially recognized unions, and by law you cannot strike. It is illegal for you to quit your job for the duration of the contract.

YOU WILL BE STOPPED and searched frequently in the streets and in your home by heavily armed police. If your passbook is not in order, you will be immediately deported to a reservation. Indeed, you will be permitted to stay out of the reservations ("homelands") only in so far as you are a highly profitable source of cheap work.

ALL POLITICAL ORGANIZATIONS DESIGNED TO CHANGE THIS SYSTEM ARE BANNED. SUSPICION OF SUCH ACTIVITY IS SUFFICIENT CAUSE FOR ARREST AND INDEFINITE DETENTION WITHOUT TRIAL.
